

Supervisors' Minute Book, No. 7, Shelby County, Iowa.

Session, 191

Harlan, Iowa, July 9, 1918

The Board of Supervisors met today as per adjournment with members N. H. Johnson, Deputy Hans Brodersen and Geo. E. Miller and County Auditor Glen P. Howard present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The resignation of E. A. Schell, County Auditor, was presented to the Board of Supervisors and was on motion accepted. Said resignation to take effect July 10, 1918.

The Board on motion appointed Glen P. Howard as County Auditor for the unexpired term ending December 31, 1918.

The bond of Glen P. Howard as County Auditor in the sum of \$5000.00 was presented to the Board and approved.

The Board approved the appointment by Ernest M. Miller, County Attorney, of V. H. Byers to act as Acting County Attorney during the absence of Mr. Miller who is now in the service of the United States.

The Board approved the following Quarterly Reports:

Auditor's Report

A petition having been filed asking for a change or addition to the road between Section 9 and 16, Union township, and the Board being unable to make proper arrangement with the owner for the purchase of this land, the Board passed the following resolution:

"WHEREAS, a petition having been filed asking for addition to the road between Secs. 9 and 16, Union Township, and whereas an Engineer having been appointed and he having made a survey of the road, and whereas the Board failed to come to an agreement for the purchase of land for this addition to this road,

Be it resolved that the County Auditor be directed to appoint Commissioners to appraise the damage to adjacent land, if any, and to make report on their findings."

The Board approved the issuance of a warrant by the County Auditor drawn on the Poor Fund in favor of Paul Gravesen in the sum of \$25.00, being aid for the month of June, 1918, drawn on the Poor Fund and they directed the County Auditor to issue warrant/to the said Paul Gravesen in the sum of \$30.00 per month until ordered discontinued.

The Board then took up the auditing of claims which work was continued until noon, when the Board on motion adjourned to 1:30 o'clock P. M.

The Board met at 1:30 o'clock P. M. as per adjournment and again took up the auditing of claims which work was in due time completed. (For list of claims audited and allowed see Claim Register No. 9.)

The Board on motion adjourned to August 12, 1918 at 9:00 o'clock A. M.
