

Supervisors' Minute Book, No. 7, Shelby County, Iowa.

Session, 1913

Harlan, Iowa, June 2, 1913.

The Board met in regular session this day with all members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Board then commenced the equalization of assessments for the year 1913. After examining the schedules returned by the assessors, the Board decided to accept the assessments of lands and lots as returned, but made the following changes in personal property assessment:-

Jefferson Township--Two year old steers, raised 30%.

Douglas Township----Two year old steers, raised 10%.

Monroe Township-----Two year old steers, raised 10%.

Board then adjourned to 1:30 P. M.

Board met at 1:30 P. M. as per adjournment.

A Committee of the Womens Union of Harlan presented a petition requesting the Board of Supervisors to allow the ladies to continue the use of the Ladies Rest Room. After considering this matter for some time the Board directed the Auditor to notify the President of the Womens Union that the County is in need of the room for the use of the County Engineer and that said room should be vacated on or before June 10, 1913, the ladies to retain the use of the room in the southwest corner of the Court House basement.

On motion Hans Brodersen was appointed committee on Court House and Jail.

The Board approved the bond of J. H. Mayne, who is to make the preliminary survey for the Drainage ditch petitioned for by Fred Mortensen et al.

The Board granted the application of Daniel Ott for cancellation of the second installment of the 1912 taxes in the Town of Defiance, which application was granted on account of a double assessment.

Upon the recommendation of Geo. W. Ickes et al, W. H. Brown of Shelby was appointed Justice of the Peace to fill vacancy.

Board then approved the bond of C. E. Wright, County Engineer, in the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000.00).

Board then adjourned to 8:30 A. M. June 3, 1913.

Board met at 8:30 A. M. June 3, 1913, as per adjournment.

A delegation of citizens and tax payers of Grove township appeared before the Board objecting to the portion of the County Road system as now laid out in said Grove township. The Board promised to make an investigation and ascertain what could be done.

The Board then proceeded to the auditing and allowing of claims.

Board adjourned to 1:30 P. M.

Board met at 1:30 P. M. and completed the auditing and allowing of claims.

On motion Board adjourned to Monday, June 9, 1913, at which time settlement with the Treasurer will be made.
