Session, 191

Harlan, Iowa, July 15, 1913.

The Board of Supervisors met in Special Session today with all members present. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The Board then examined and approved the following Quarterly Reports:--

Recorder's Report.

To the County Board of Supervisors of Shelby County, Iowa.

I, the undersigned, Henry F. Wunder, County Recorder of Shelby County, Iowa, do hereby certify and report that, during the quarter year ended June 30, 1913, I collected as fees for recording instruments of record as provided by law, the aggregate sum of \$284.70.

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The Board then approved the bond of C. W. McNaughton, as Deputy Sheriff in the sum of \$2000.00.

The Board on motion adjourned to 1:30 P. M.

The Board met at 1:30 P. M. as per adjournment.

In view of the fact that the State Highway Commission at a conference with the Board of Supervisors and the Lana Construction Company accepted the prices in the yearly contract made between the Board of Supervisors and the Lana Construction Company on the 28th day of December, 1912, the following agreement was entered into:-

It was agreed that for the bridge between Sections 16 and 21, in Cass Township, and between Sections 3 and 10 in Jefferson township, that we would approve a steel bridge with board floor and steel tubular piers for supports. The design of the superstructure is to be in accordance with the Highway Commission's design for 70ft. steel bridge heavy enough to carry a concrete floor, and using steel joists.

For the bridge between Sections 23 and 26 in Washington township it was agreed that a permanent steel bridge with concrete floor and concrete abutments should be used. Designs to be in accordance with the Highway Commission's standard design for steel bridges with concrete floors.

For the bridge in Mr. Pryor's district, near Shelby, it was agreed that Mr. Lana could put in the 70-foot bridge which he now has on hand, and which is not in accordance with the Highway Commission's standard design. This concession was made because, as stated by Mr. Lana, Mr. Jacobson had ordered a 70-foot steel bridge for Shelby County before Mr. Jacobson left the Board of Supervisors.

The 70-foot steel bridge to be built in Mr. Pryor's district would come under the yearly contract now in force between Shelby County and the Lana Construction Company, and consequently the prices as stipulated in the yearly contract would govern in the construction of this bridge. On the basis of this yearly contract the approximate cost of this bridge would be \$1928.28.

For the bridge between Sections 16 and 21, Cass Township, and Sections 3 and 10, Jefferson township, it was agreed that because of the fact that these bridges may be moved on account of drainage ditches being constructed across the road in these locations that the steel superstructure should be made heavy enough to carry a concrete floor, but that a wood floor should be put on at this time, and the spans supported on steel tubes.

The prices, as stipulated in the yearly contract, would not govern in the construction of these bridges because of the fact that the bridges will be considerably heavier than the bridges which Mr. Lana bid on in the yearly contract. For this reason the yearly contract was adjusted by making the Supplementary Agreement for metal work on the pound basis, as shown on the agreement attached hereto.

On the basis of this supplementary agreement the 70-foot steel span, with steel joists, and supported on tubular piers would cost \$2438.99.

For the bridge located between Sections 23 and 26 in Washington Township, it appears that the stream is not likely to be straightened, and for that reason it was agreed that a steel bridge with a concrete floor and concrete abutments would be best suited for this location. Such a bridge would cost \$5196.01.

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The following agreement was entered into between Shelby County, Iowa, and the Lana Construction Company:--

It is understood and agreed that because of the yearly contract now in existence between the Lana Construction Company and Shelby County, and in consideration of being allowed to go ahead with the work without delay, the following prices are to be used for steel bridge work and foundations ordered during 1913 by Shelby County in lieu of prices contained in the annual contract.

These prices are to cover the bridge work ordered during the life of the present blanket contract. Specific plans and specifications are to be supplied for each structure in accordance with the Standard plans of the State Highway Commission, and all work is to be done in accordance therewith.

Steel work, riveted trusses, designs to be furnished by the Highway Commission.

It is further understood that detail drawings for steel tubular piers will be submitted by the Lana Construction Company, and that this design will be used in making up the abutment plans.

The Board then began the auditing of claims and after due time completed said auditing and allowing of claims. (For Claims audited and allowed see Claim Register No. 7.)

The Board of Supervisors made an order instructing the County Auditor to draw a warrant in favor of Mrs. C. H. Best to pay for the burial and for a monument for C. H. Best, deceased, a veteran of the Civil War.

The Board on motion approved the bank depository bond of the Harlan National Bank in the sum of \$25,000.00.

The Board on motion adjourned subject to call of County Auditor.
