

Supervisors' Minute Book, No. 7, Shelby County, Iowa.

Session, 191

Harlan, Iowa, December 19, 1913.

The Board of Supervisors of Shelby County, Iowa, met today as per call of the County Auditor with all members present.

The Board on motion approved the Depository Bond of the Farmers Bank of Elk Horn in the sum of \$10,000.00.

The Board on motion cancelled the poll tax of Clarke McConnell for the year 1911 on account of the fact that Mr. McConnell was a member of the Harlan Fire Department.

The Board cancelled the taxes of Mrs. Daniel Soesbe for the year 1912 on lots 7 & 8 in Block 86, McDonalds Addition to the City of Harlan.

The taxes of Ulrick Summers for the year 1912 on Lots 4-5-6 in Block 16, Town of Harlan, were also ordered cancelled.

The Board then granted the Consent Road Petition of R. G. Penniston for land in Section 8, Township 81 Range 38 for additional highway, in order to avoid additional bridging.

Upon the recommendation of the City ^{assessor} Council of Harlan, the Board granted a refund to the Harlan Chautauqua Association for their taxes for the years 1911 and 1912 on Lots 9-10-19-20 in Block 2, College Heights Addition to Harlan, in the amount of \$14.14.

The Board ^{received} granted the application of the Avoca Light & Power Company, ~~on condition~~ ^{for a grant of certain roads for the purpose of constructing their pole lines} that said company pay the costs of publication, and the County Auditor was instructed to have notice published as required by law, ^{and Jan-5-1914 was set as a day for hearing}

The Board cancelled the taxes for the year 1912 on the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 14-79-37, belonging to Mrs. Andrew Peterson on account of her inability to contribute to the public revenue.

The Auditor was instructed to issue a warrant each month in the sum of \$28.00 for the care of Ida Jorgensen, a tuberculosis patient. This allowance to begin January 1, 1914 and to be paid monthly in advance.

The Board then commenced the auditing and allowing of claims.

The Board adjourned to 1:30 P. M.

The Board met at 1:30 P. M. as per adjournment and resumed the auditing of claims.

The Board renewed the contract with Chas. A. Rice, as Steward of the County Home and Farm for the year 1914. Mr. Rice also filed his bond in the sum of \$2000.00, which bond was on motion approved.

After completing the auditing and allowing of claims the Board on motion adjourned subject to call of the County Auditor. (For list of Claims audited and allowed see Claim Register No. 7.)
