The Board of Supervisors then proceeded to fix the compensation of Assessors of Shelby County for year 1918, by the following resolution which was unanimously adopted:

"Be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Shelby County, Iowa, that the compensation of the Town and Township Assessors for the year 1918 be fixed at \$3.00 per day of eight hours each, provided that all books are returned completely balanced and recapitulation sheets made; otherwise the compensation shall be \$2.50 per day for the number of days allotted to the precinct.

The following ~~###~~ number of days was allotted to each district: Jefferson 38; Greeley 37; Defiance 11; Washington 34; Westphalia 40; Douglas 37; Polk 37; Center 35; Lincoln 37; Portsmouth 14; Shelby Township 35; Fairview 38; Clay 36; Irwin 11; Union 34; Grove 37; Panama 11; Earling 11; Kirkman 10; Jackson 40; Harlan 100; Cass 35; Tennant 10; Shelby Town 26; Monroe 37; Elk Horn 17.

On motion H. D. Copeland was employed as Janitor for Court House for the year 1918 at a salary of \$80.00 per month.

The Board on motion adjourned to January 3, 1918 at 9:00 o'clock A. M.
